AMENDED ORDINANCE

SECTION FOUR

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 409

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO DOGS AND CATS  
RUNNING AT LARGE WITHIN THE CORPORATE  
LIMITS OF THE CITY OF SUMNER, ILLINOIS

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL of the City of Sumner,  
Lawrence County, Illinois:

SECTION ONE:

It shall be unlawful to suffer or permit any dog or cat to run at large in the City of Sumner, Illinois, after the 9<sup>th</sup> day of May, 2000, and it shall be the duty of the registered owner of every dog or cat to keep same safely and securely tied or confined. Any dog or cat found upon any public street, sidewalk, alley, parkway or other unenclosed place during the said period shall be deemed running at large, unless such dog or cat is firmly held on a leash or is in an enclosed vehicle.

SECTION TWO:

The keeping, maintaining or harboring of a dog or dogs which by barking, yelping, howling, baying, or making other loud noises disturbs the comfort, peace, and quietude of any neighborhood is hereby declared to be a nuisance and no person owning, keeping, maintaining or harboring a dog or dogs shall suffer or permit such dog or dogs to disturb the comfort, peace, and quiet of a neighborhood by barking, yelping, howling, baying or making other loud or unusual noises.

SECTION THREE:

Any dog or cat found in the City of Sumner, Illinois, running at large, under conditions set forth in Sections 1 above, is hereby declared to be a public nuisance and may be impounded by the Police Department.

SECTION FOUR:

Any dog or cat found in the City of Sumner, tied and confined on private property must be at least ten (10) feet from any public street, sidewalk, alley, parkway or other enclosed place. Any fence that is used to confine any dog or cat must be at least ten (10) feet from the street, alley, sidewalk or parkway.

SECTION FIVE:

Any owner or keeper of a fierce or dangerous animal who shall knowingly permit the same to run at large, to the danger, annoyance or damage of persons within the City, shall be deemed guilty of keeping and maintaining a nuisance.


SECTION SIX:

Any person, firm or corporation, violating this Ordinance, or any Section thereof, shall be fined not less than SEVENTY-FIVE DOLLARS (\$75.00), nor more than FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$500.00), for each offense, and a separate offense shall be deemed committed on each day or on which a violation occurs or continues.

SECTION SEVEN:

This Ordinance shall take effect and be effective from the dates of its passage as provided by law.
